

Reporting Levels of Achievement Years 11 and 12

Assessment procedures at these levels are governed by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority and are based on demonstrating successful achievement of required outcomes. Students complete examinations in all studies.

As in Years 7 – 10, each student is issued with a detailed written report for each subject at the end of each semester. These reports detail progress and achievement in a number of key behaviours and work habits as well as outcomes of specific assessment tasks and coursework.

Reporting

Students receive one formal, written report each semester. Where there are concerns about a student's work, Progress reports are also completed.

Years 11 & 12 (VCE)

As well as descriptive assessments, reports contain information on the following:

Unit result for all subjects, Units 1-3, is either S or N.

- S is used to indicate satisfactory completion of the Unit.
- N is used to indicate that the Unit has not been satisfactorily completed.

An S is gained by satisfactorily achieving each outcome for the Unit.

Levels of achievement (VCE Grades)
